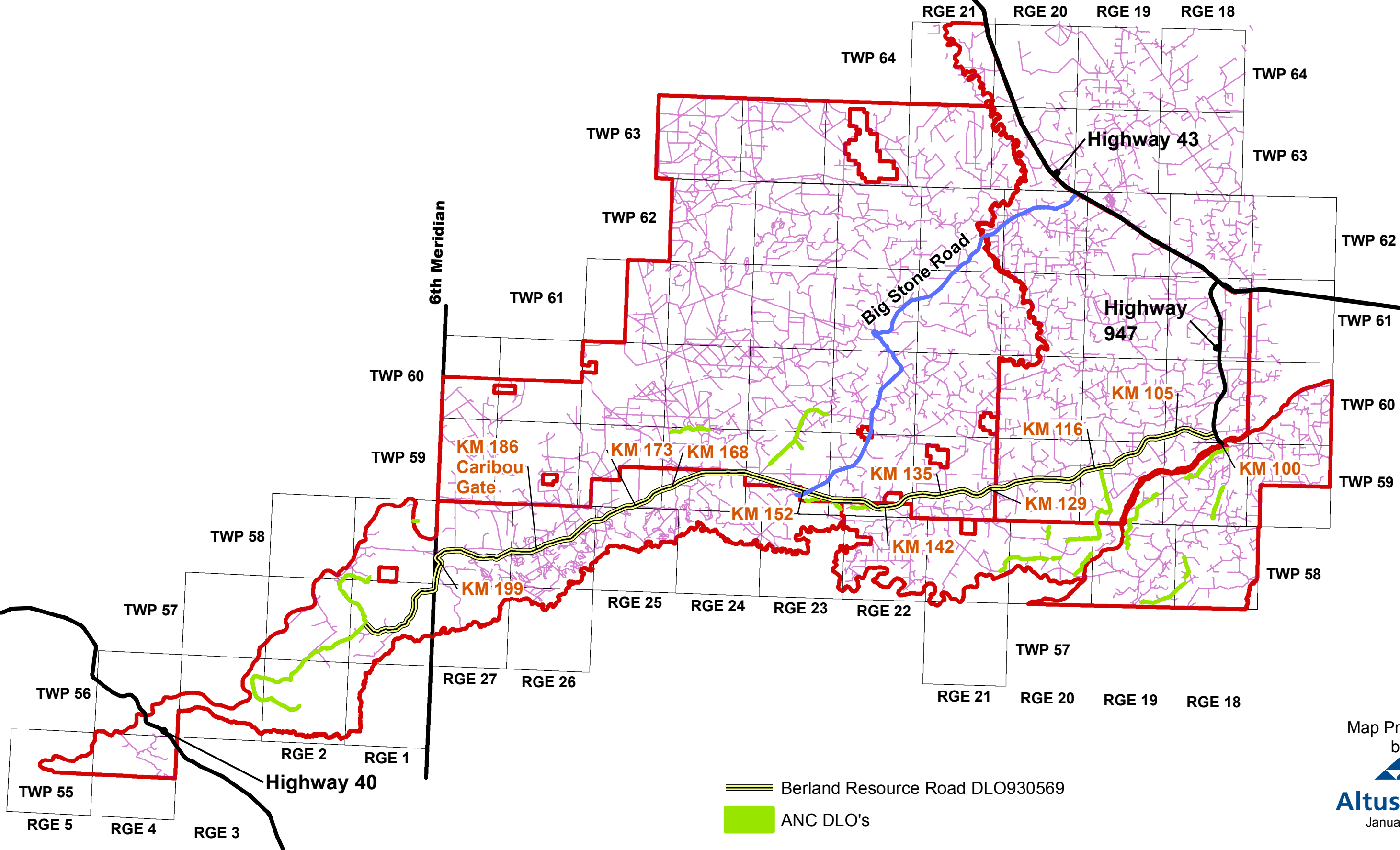
The bridge at km 135 on the Berland Road will be open after noon (12pm) on Saturday June 9th – still no access through prior to this time

Schedule "C"

ANC TIMBER LTD. RULES OF THE ROAD(S)

All Operators must be familiar with these rules prior to using any ANC owned road:

PLEASE OBEY ALL POSTED SPEED SIGNS

RADAR SPEED ENFORCEMENT IS IN AFFECT -SPEED INFRACTIONS ARE SUBJECT TO FINES

- Travel on ANC roads may occur during dry or frozen conditions only. Essential traffic during wet periods will be subject to a surcharge and must be pre-approved via www.ancroad.com prior to use.
- Travel during posted road bans must be authorized in advance by ANC Timber Road Use Coordinator and may be subject to a surcharge. Road ban information can be found on ANC Timber's website www.ancroad.com.
- Travel on Grantor roads must occur in compliance with the statutes of the Province of Alberta governing vehicular traffic use.
- The use of chains is restricted to periods when roads have sufficient ice pack or emergency situations only. Users of chains during non- ice pack / frozen conditions are subject to fines and/or surcharges, or loss of road use privileges, due to the damage that chain use causes. **Users of chains are restricted to a maximum speed limit of 50km /hr.**
- No lugged/ tracked equipment is permitted to cross any ANC bridge unless wood/ tires or other protective measures are utilized to protect the bridge deck. Failure to adhere to this requirement will result in a fine/ surcharge or loss of road use privileges.
- Equipment / machinery **MUST NOT** be parked on, or alongside, any ANC road or other disposition (ie. The Knight Yard at 101km). If equipment/machinery is to be stopped or staged for any reason, prior permission must be obtained from ANC at (780) 778-1035.
- Emergency situations, breakdowns, incidents, accidents, hazards or other safety concerns are to be reported to ANC at (780) 778-1035.
- Users shall observe and obey all signs, postings and notices provided by ANC or its staff or designate including any closures or barriers.
- Gates must be kept locked at all times. Failure to do so will result in the termination of the road use agreement.
- Users must obey any direction provided to them, in writing or otherwise, by ANC staff and/or designate.
- Alberta Infrastructure and Transportation standard weight and load restrictions apply to all ANC roads, except with specific written permission from ANC.
- ANC may require the Grantee (at the Grantee's sole expense) to ensure all Grantee vehicles are equipped with radios and the Grantor's frequency for the specific road(s) in use, and to ensure drivers use the radios in accordance with the Grantor's practice for that specific road(s).
- Where a Road Grade exists, no snowplowing, grading, or blading of any ditches and other un-travelled right-of-way portion is permitted, without the permission of the ANC or it's designate.
- Forest fire discoveries must be reported immediately to 310-FIRE.
